Residents of MD can apply for a nondriver identification (ID) card, which serves as proof of photo identification for children and adults who do not hold active driver's licenses.

Requirements:

- Reside in the state of MD (must present proof of state residency)
- Must NOT hold a valid driver's license or moped permit
- Provide proof of age and identity
- Pay applicable fees: \$24.00 (There is no fee for an ID card if you are 65 years of age or older, or if you have a disability which limits a major life activity).

ID cards for individuals 18 years of age and older will be valid for a period of up to 8 years; for those under the age of 18, ID cards will be valid for up to 5 years.

- Applicant must occupy the property as his/her primary residence.
- Applicant must have a mortgage with a past balance or, if the applicant doesn't not have a mortgage, homeowner's insurance, property taxes, or water bills with past due balances.
- The applicant must demonstrate a loss or reduction of income causing economic hardship.

Child Care Scholarship Program

The Child Care Scholarship (CSS) formerly known as Child Care Subsidy) program helps eligible families in Maryland pay for high-quality childcare and early education programs.

The new Fast Track Child Care Scholarship application process shortens your wait to three (3) business days to get help with childcare expenses and 60 days of childcare assistance while your Childcare Scholarship application is processed, if you are eligible! To be eligible for the CSS Program, you must be:

- A Maryland resident who is working/employed, in an approved training program or attending school. For families where both parents live within the same household, both parents must meet all eligibility requirements.
- A recipient of Temporary Cash Assistance (TCA) or Supplemental Security Income (SSI) or within CSS income guidelines.
- Willing to have your child immunized to Maryland state standards to provide documentation supporting Exemption from Immunization.
- Willing to provide proof that each child needing childcare is a citizen of the US or a qualified alien (provide a Birth Certificate for each child or documentation that certifies the child's status.) NOTE: Parents <u>ARE NOT</u> required to be citizens of the United States.
- Willing to provide proof of identity for all members within

the household composition.
(Proof of identity for the parent can be any form of a government issued document. The birth certificate or immigration status documentation can serve as proof of identity for each child in the household composition.)

Can your utility service be shut off in cold weather?

Can the utility shut off your electricity and gas during the winter months if you do not pay your bills? **The short answer is yes**, but there are some restrictions.

Winter protections:

From November 1 to March 31, there are some rules to protect customers in cold weather. **However, there is**

no rule that stops shut off's just because it's winter.

- No service shut offs are allowed on days when the forecast at 6am shows the temperature will be 32 degrees or below in your area, in the next 72 hours.
- For gas service, this rule only applies in hot weather if you use gas to cool your home.

Service can't be shut off for small bills:

- The utility cannot turn off your service if your gas or electricity bill is \$200 or less.
- Your service can't be shut off if your combined gas and electricity bill is \$300 or less.



MOBILE APP

1. Download the application, when accessing Language Line for the first time:

iPhone or iPad	Android Device
Tap the App Store icon and search for "LanguageLine InSight". Tap "Get" and "Install". After download is complete, tap "Interpreters" icon. Enter Authentication Code and Device Name. Tap "Activate Device" Tap "OK" to allow access to your microphone.	 Tap the Google Play store icon and search "Language Line". Tap "Interpreters" icon. Then tap "Install". After download is complete, tap "Open". Tap "OK", then tap "Allow" to allow access to your microphone and camera. Enter Authentication Code and Device Name.

- 2. Open the Language Line application on your device.
- Select the language you need from the list of 200+ languages. If the language is not known, please show the Limited English Proficient (LEP) individual your screen and ask them to point to their language.

TELEPHONE

- (If you are using an interpreter for an in-person interaction, begin at Step 2.)
 Let the LEP customer know that you are connecting with an interpreter and place them on hold. Then press the transfer key (a) (or "Add Call" on a cellphone).
- 2. Dial 1-855-412-6120.
- If prompted for your Client ID, enter 525285. (You will likely not be asked for this number)
- 4. Select the language you need: Press 1 for Spanish, or 2 for all other languages.
 - a. Press 0 for unknown language, if you are unable to identify the customer's language, to connect to a representative to assist with language identification.
- Enter the access code for your agency/department: 50, followed by the pound (#) sign. You may be placed on hold while an interpreter is connected to the call.
- 6. (Skip if in-person interaction) When the interpreter is on the call, press the transfer key again to have the interpreter join the call with LEP customer.

TIPS FOR WORKING WITH LANGUAGE LINE INTERPRETERS

Talk to the LEP individual, not to the interpreter. Verify understanding by asking the LEP individual questions or to summarize the conversation. Speak slower than usual and use simpler language. Avoid jargon, slang, acronyms, idioms, etc. Say 2 or 3 sentences at a time to ensure effective interpretation of exactly what you are saying.

Brief the interpreter, summarizing the purpose of the call and any special instructions. Record the name and ID number of the interpreter. If your call is disconnected, dial 1-855-412-6120, press 0, and provide the interpreter's name and ID to be reconnected with the same interpreter. If you have concerns about the quality of the interpreter, dial customer service at 1-800-752-6096 and provide the interpreter's name and ID.
